

# **2021 Street Rehabilitation Project**

Construction Update

July 30, 2021

#### **Watermain Replacement:**

The contractor has completed the installation of the watermain and water services on Monroe Street. Homeowners on Monroe Street will still be on temporary water until the new watermain has been tested and activated. The contractor will continue watermain replacement on the *Rice Creek Terrace* section between 68<sup>th</sup> Avenue and Madison Street on Monday, August 2<sup>nd</sup> and intends to start replacement for the Rice Creek Terrace section between Oakley Street and Brookview Drive at the end of next week. While the watermain work is taking place there will be occurrences when the water will be shut off for a duration of 4 to 6 hours. In general, residents will receive a notice in the form of a door hanger a day before the water is shut-off.

#### **Street Grading:**

During the week of August 2<sup>nd</sup>, the street contractor will start following behind the utility contractor on the streets where the watermain work has been completed. The street contractor will use aggregate material generated from reclamation of the streets to grade to an elevation in preparation of the installation of concrete curb & gutter and the first lift of asphalt.

#### **Resident Access**

Residents will have access to their driveways during construction except when major construction events are occurring on their street. The City and Contractor will collaborate in minimizing the inconvenience to residents during construction. Please keep in mind that this type of construction may generate noise, dust and mud. Generally, it can be a disruption to the neighborhood, but we are working together toward a common goal.

## **Worksite Safety**

Although it is tempting and interesting to watch, it is very important that residents, including children, remain out of the immediate work zone. Please remember to be safe and drive cautiously wherever you see construction workers, equipment and warning signs.

If you have an emergency, the City of Fridley's after hours contact is (763) 427-1212. This is an Anoka County Dispatch and they will direct your call.

The contractor's hours will be from 7:00 a.m. to 7:00 p.m., Monday – Friday. There is potential for occasional work on Saturdays upon City approval. Additionally, the project covers a large area (2 miles). There may be times when you will not see continuous construction activity on your street. The contractor is likely in another area of the project.
